

Turabian: Print Sources

NOTE: The letter N is used to indicate examples of footnotes or endnotes and the letter B is used to indicate examples of bibliographic entries. Students should NOT include either letter in their papers.

Government Documents

NOTE: Include as many of the following elements as possible:

- Government
- Government body
- Title of document
- Individual author, editor, or compiler
- Report number or other identifiers
- Place of publication, publisher's name, and date of publication
