

Cullowhee Valley Broadband Access Project Response to Written Questions

1. On the proposal it mentions 3350+ customers, does this count every single apartment in say Catamount Peak apartment complex as a customer or is the entire Catamount Peak apartment complex count as 1 customer? If this apartment complex counts as 1 customer are there any other apartment complexes that only count as 1 customer as well?

The customer count of 3350+ represents metered accounts. Community apartment complexes are a mixture of single meter per building and meters per each unit/apartment. Additional breakout for apartment complexes will be provided to selected provider(s).

Would WCP consider changing poles at no cost to help us build the broadband network?

Yes. Pending scope and/or extent of required electric utility re-work. To be evaluated in context with provider's proposal.

3. Will or can WCP legally give us right of way on their pole line across properties so we do not have to acquire that for ourselves?

If additional right-of-way (ROW) and/or easement is required, WCU agrees to help facilitate acquisition.

4. Would they let us attach to their poles at no cost or no cost for a certain period of time to help cover the cost of building the broadband network?

Yes. To be evaluated in context with provider's proposal.

5. Do you have GIS Data/Maps with demographics of the 3350 customers?

No.

6. Do you have GIS Data/Maps with information on the size and locations of the poles?

No; WCP recognizes the need for updated GIS/Maps for the electric distribution network and is willing to consider acquiring and/or providing this service. WCP will also entertain the provider to supply this service at cost.

7. If a pole change-out is required who covers the cost?

Reference question #2 above.

8. Will WCU provide locations for potential point of presence (POP) sites? If so, where are they?

No specific property or locations have been identified; however, WCU is willing to consider placement of POP on WCU controlled property.

9. BalsamWest in most cases is required to obtain an additional easement for telecommunications even though a power utility easement is in place. Will WCU be responsible for obtaining these easements?

If additional right-of-way (ROW) and/or easement is required, WCU agrees to help facilitate acquisition.

10. Will WCU provide access to their poles for fixed wireless internet equipment?

Yes.

11. Knowing you have 2 bucket trucks, 1 Auger truck, 1 Chipper truck and 6 service trucks... Would WCU crew help assist w/install and maintenance of fiber?
