Graduate School & Research Recurring Budget Priority 1



- \$100,000 Graduate Assistantships (GAs)
 - Our growing undergraduate enrollment increases need for instructional capacity that could be met with GAs
 - Funds ~10 additional assistantships for Fall and Spring semesters



Graduate School & Research Recurring Budget Priority 2



• \$20,750 Research Membership and Software Subscriptions

- Grants Resource Center (\$8,800) Office of the Provost has paid this membership in the past
- Foundation Directory Online (\$1,300) single-user account that can be shared with faculty and staff (Hunter Library can no longer maintain the institutional subscription)
- Institutional Review Board software (IRBNet) (\$7,150) Office of the
 Provost has paid this subscription since 2016 for IRB compliance
- Collaborative Institutional Training Initiative (CITI) (\$3,500) training ensures compliance with federal training requirements for IRB, IACUC, COI, Responsible Conduct of Research, and Institutional Biosafety



Graduate School & Research Recurring Budget Priority 3



- \$29,000 Graduate Student and Faculty Development
 - Three recurring professional development events (\$9,000)
 - 3 Minute Thesis (3MT) competition
 - Graduate Education Summit for graduate faculty development
 - Graduate Research Symposium for student professional development
 - Leadership development for Graduate Program Directors, Key Staff, and Graduate Faculty (\$5,000)
 - Graduate Research Scholarly Grants (\$15,000) small grants to support graduate students' independent scholarly and research endeavors
