Eblen Vision provides eyeglasses and eye exams to those families who are living with illnesses and disabilities at no cost to them. The Healthcare Outreach Project provides funding assistance to families in need of health care that they cannot afford, with also giving them the ability to choose their own physician and care. Medication Assistance provides medication to adults living in western NC by utilizing a network of area pharmacies and negotiating some of the lowest prices in the nation. Families in need of help can continue to see their same physicians and visit their local pharmacies so care is not disrupted. Homeless Prevention and Rapid Rehousing is a stimulus funded program that provides short to midterm housing and funding to homeless or at risk for being homeless. Tenant Based Rental Assistance provides security deposits to homeless or at risk for being homeless. The Eblen Energy Project assists by providing heating oil and assistance with funding for gas and electric bills, purchasing space heaters, fans and air conditioning window units. Must bring the disconnect bill, social security cards for everyone in the household, photo identification and proof of income. Emergency Outreach Food was developed to assist children, adults and families with total healthcare and provide food to those who are hungry and living with illnesses and disabilities.</p>
