- Students with 30 or more credit hours are not eligible to take First-Year Seminar.
- Grading for the First-Year Seminar is A, B, C, or U (Unsatisfactory).
- If a student receives a grade of U in the First-Year Seminar he/she must make up the hours by taking another course in the Liberal Studies Program.
