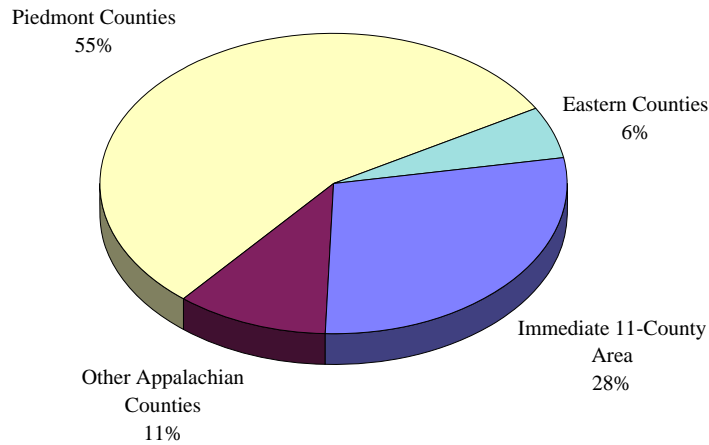

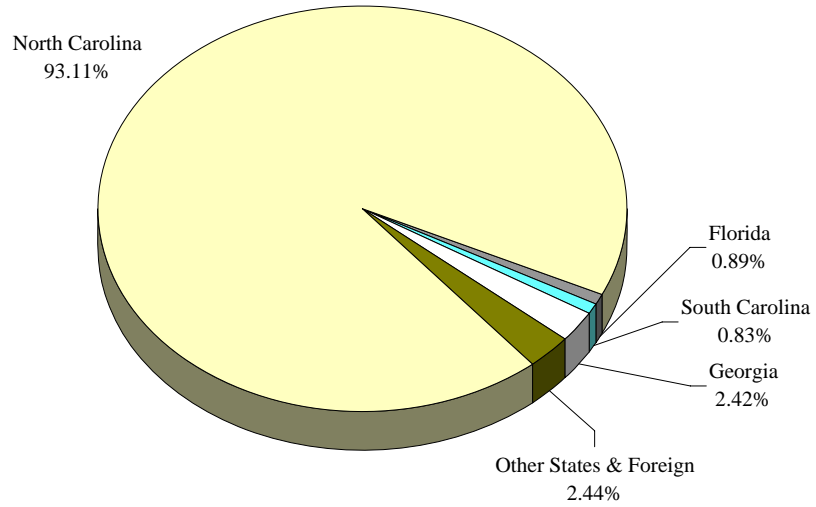

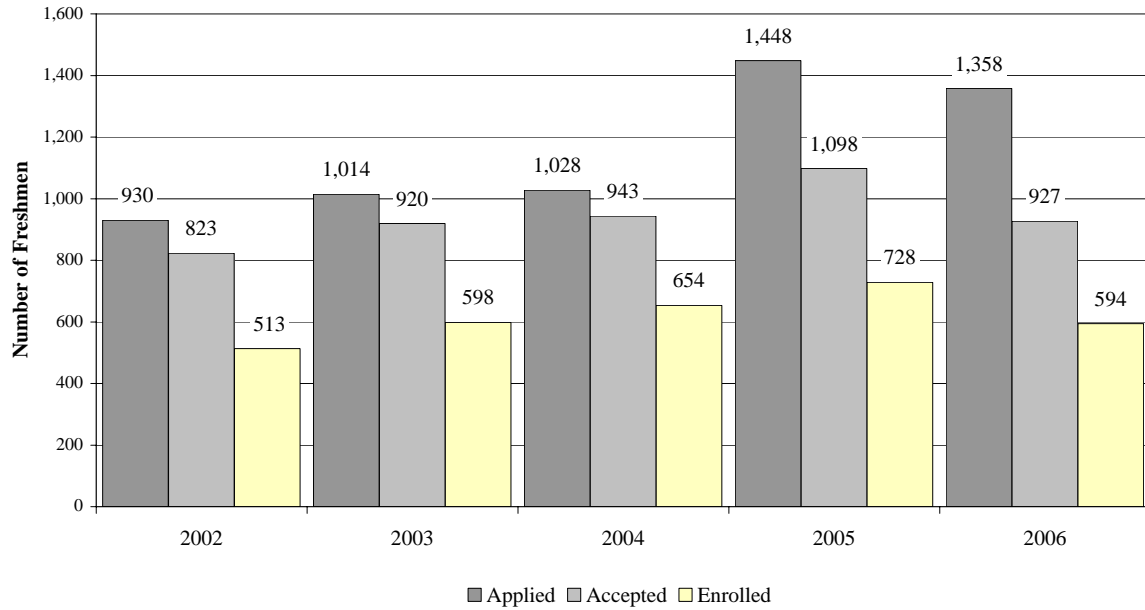

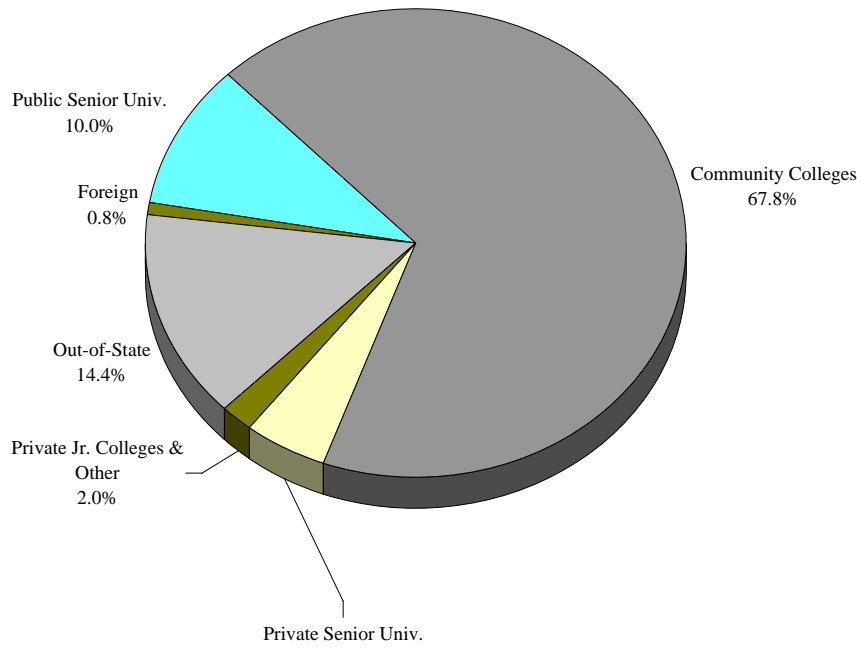

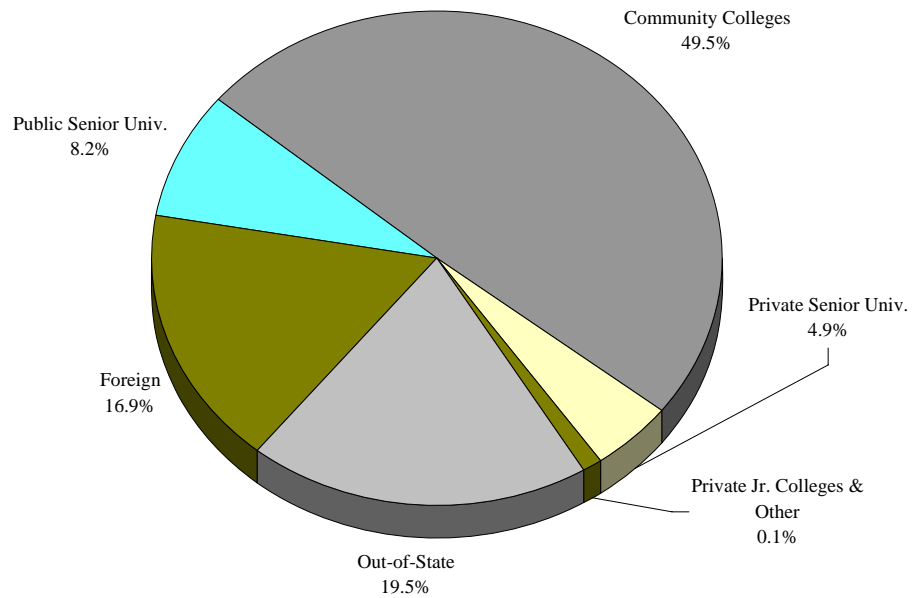

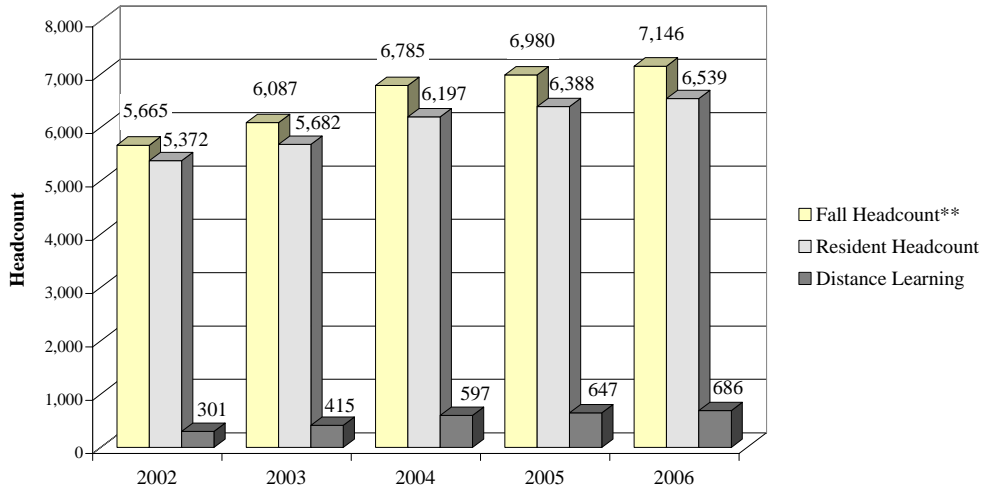

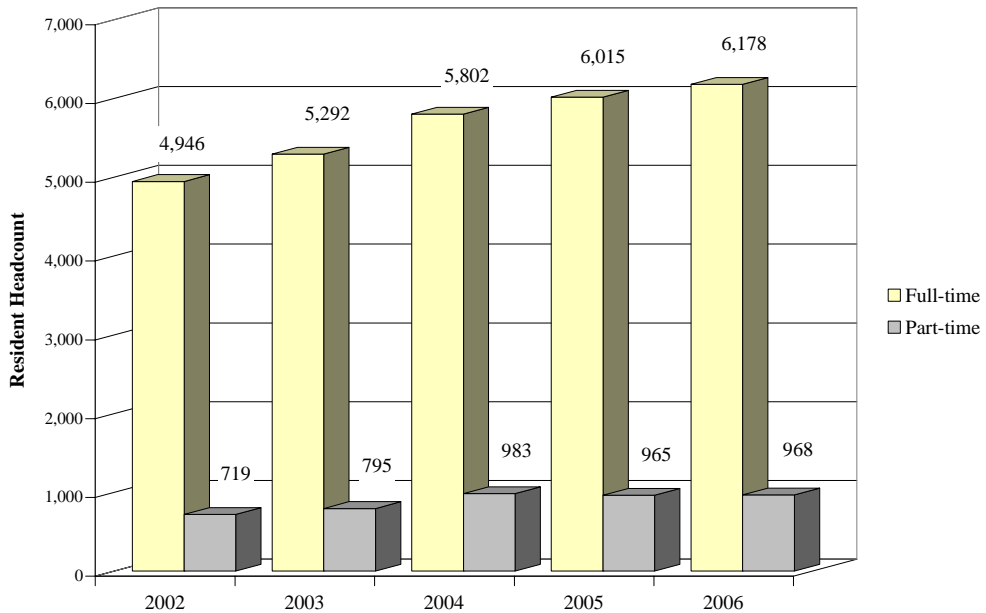

Full- and Part-Time Undergraduate Headcount Enrollment



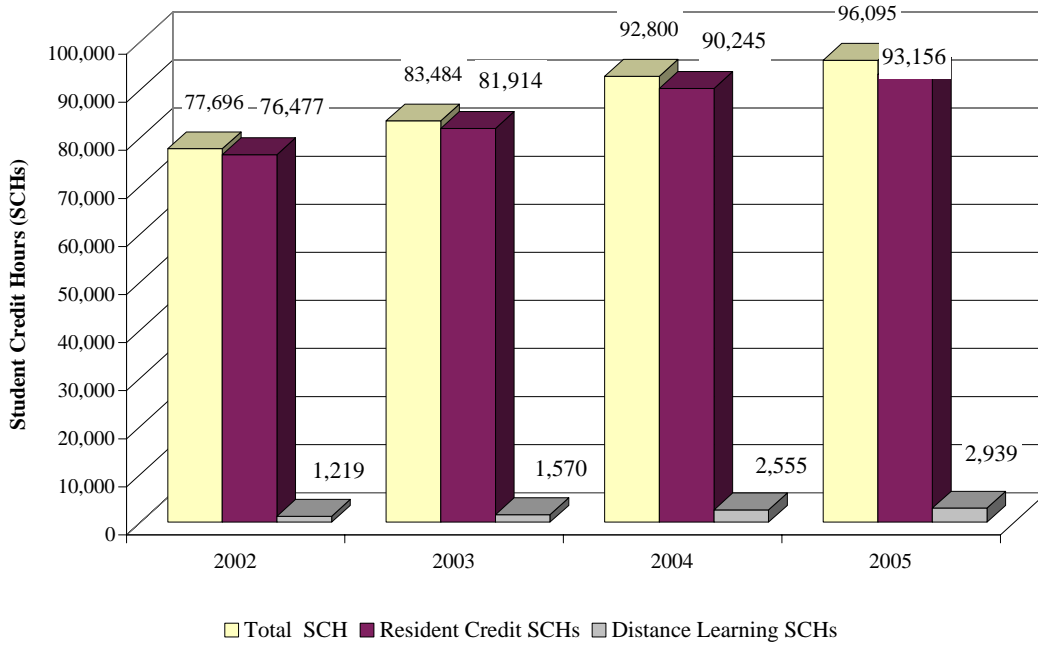

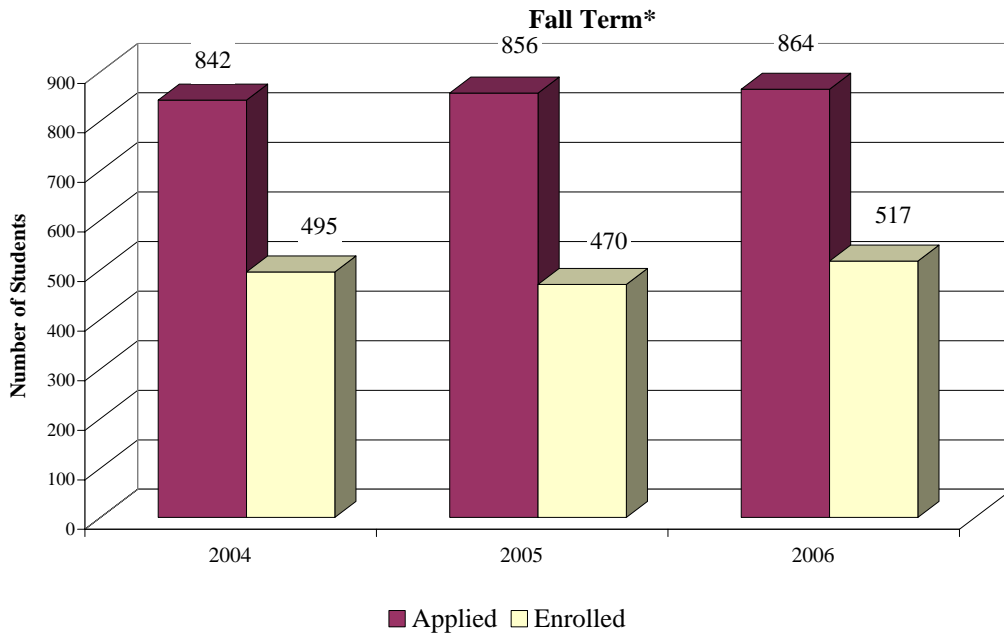

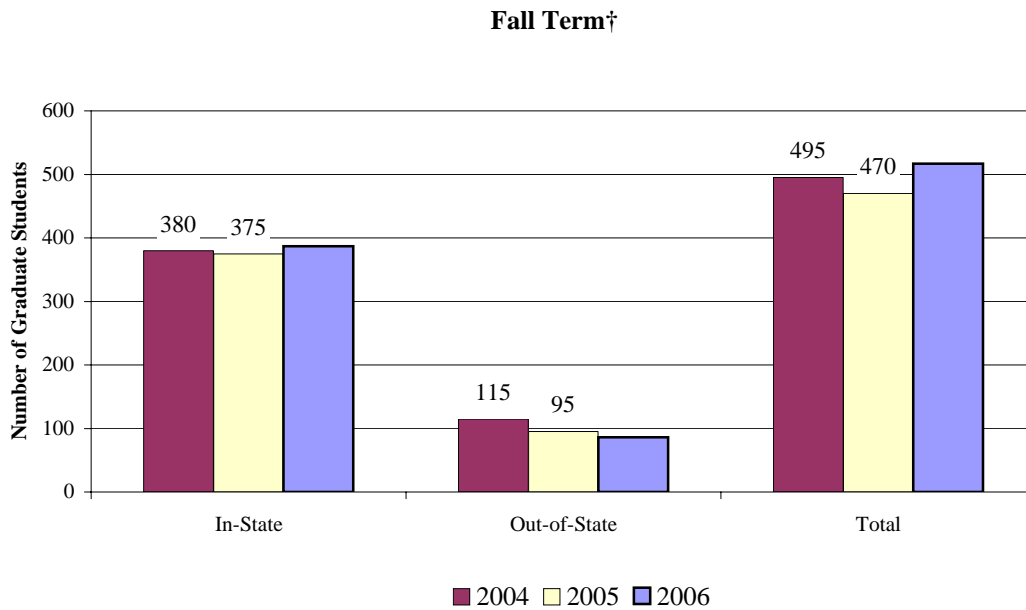
Graduate Applicants and Enrollees

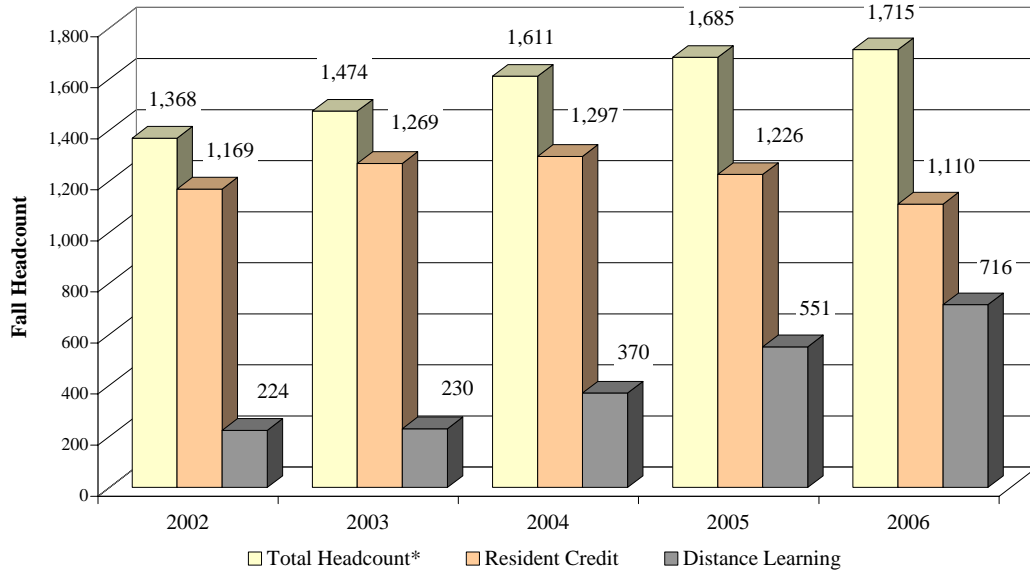

Graduate Headcount Enrollment

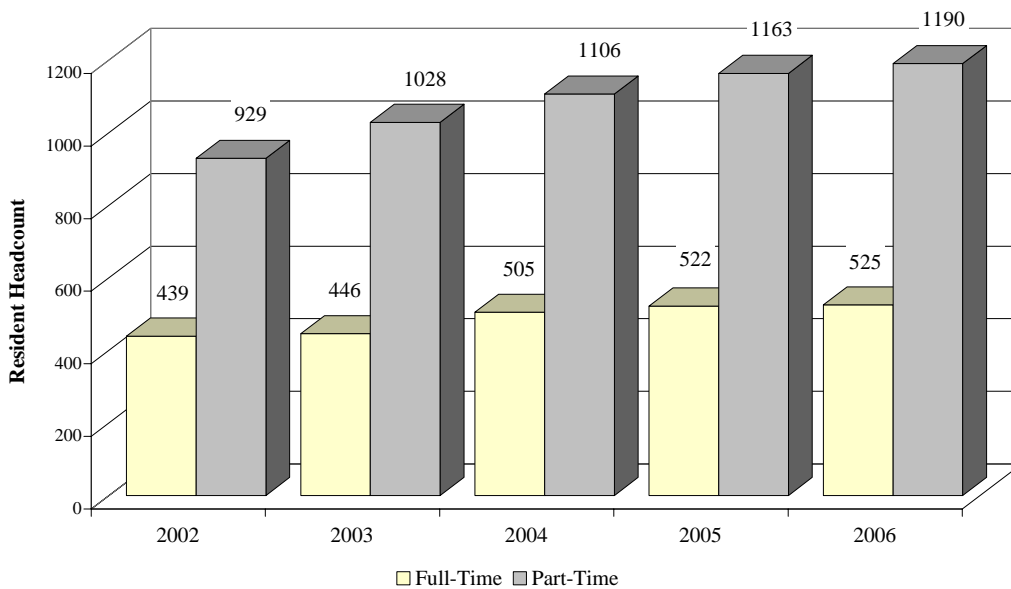

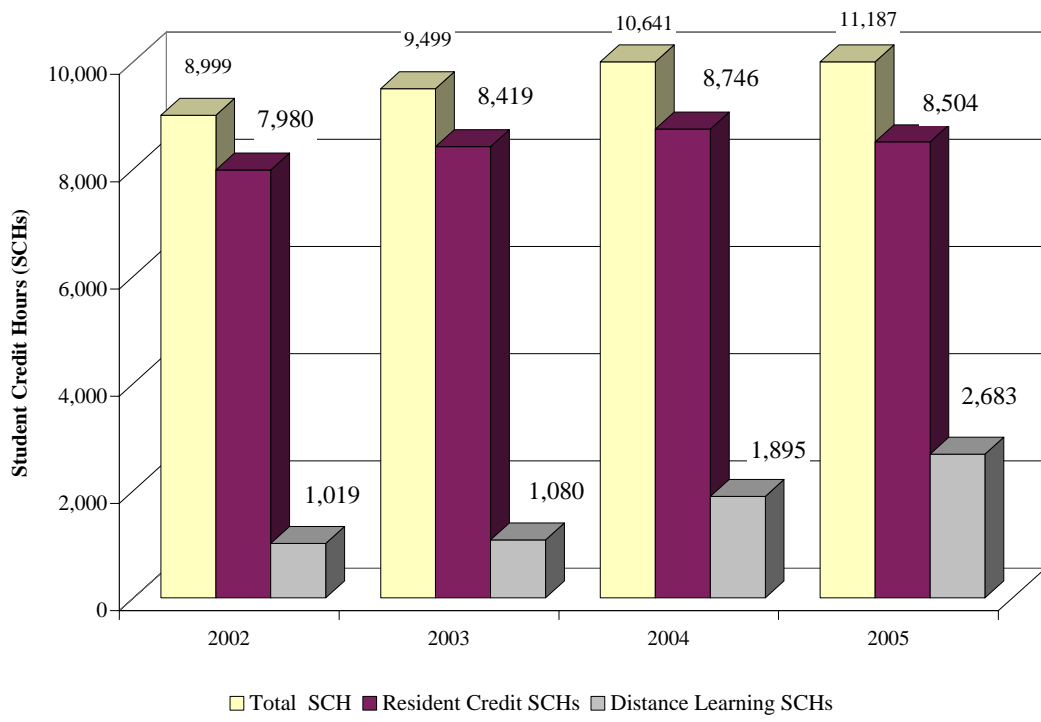

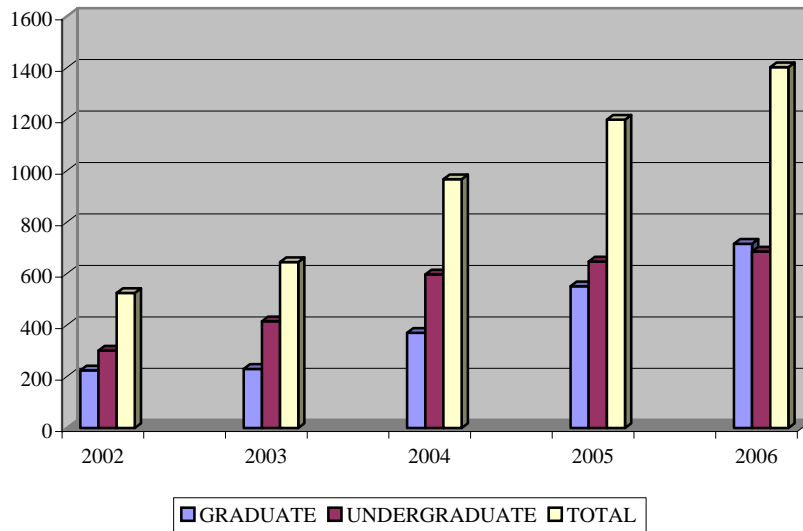
