Air Conditioner	(including gasoline, kerosene, etc.)	Toy weapons (guns, knives, etc.) that could be mistaken as being real
Ammunition	Fireworks	
Amplifiers	Halogen lights or lamps	Waterbeds
Aquariums (> 10 gallons)	Indoor grill or broiler	Weapons (including but not limited to: knives, BB guns, air/gas pistols or rifles, firearms of any type, pressurized guns, paint ball guns, stun- guns or martial arts weapons, ammunition)
Archery equipment	Kegs, party balls, funnels, bongos, and other drug paraphernalia	
Ceiling fans	Pets (other than fish)	
Cooking appliances with open coils (toasters, toaster ovens, hot plates, coffee pots)	Power tools	
Darts	Refrigerators (> than 5 amps)	
Decorative weapons	Smoke/Fog machines	Weights for body building or other large exercise equipment
