SUMMARY:

My clinical practice has included medical-surgical, cardiac step-down, and emergency room nursing in public and private acute-care facilities. I have taught associate degree and baccalaureate courses in nursing fundamentals, wellness and disease prevention, medical-surgical, and psychiatric/mental health nursing, as well as graduate courses in nursing theory, health care economics, and health care policy. My research interests include psychosocial and spiritual issues in chronic illness with a focus on HIV/AIDS.

Currently I am a tenured Associate Professor in the School of Nursing in Western Carolina University's College of Health and Human Sciences. I serve as Director for the School of Nursing where I supervise pre-licensure, RN to BSN, and MS programs (Family Nurse Practitioner, Nursing Education, Nursing Anesthesia, and Nursing Administration), 32 faculty and 6 staff, as well as budgets of approximately 2 million dollars annually.
