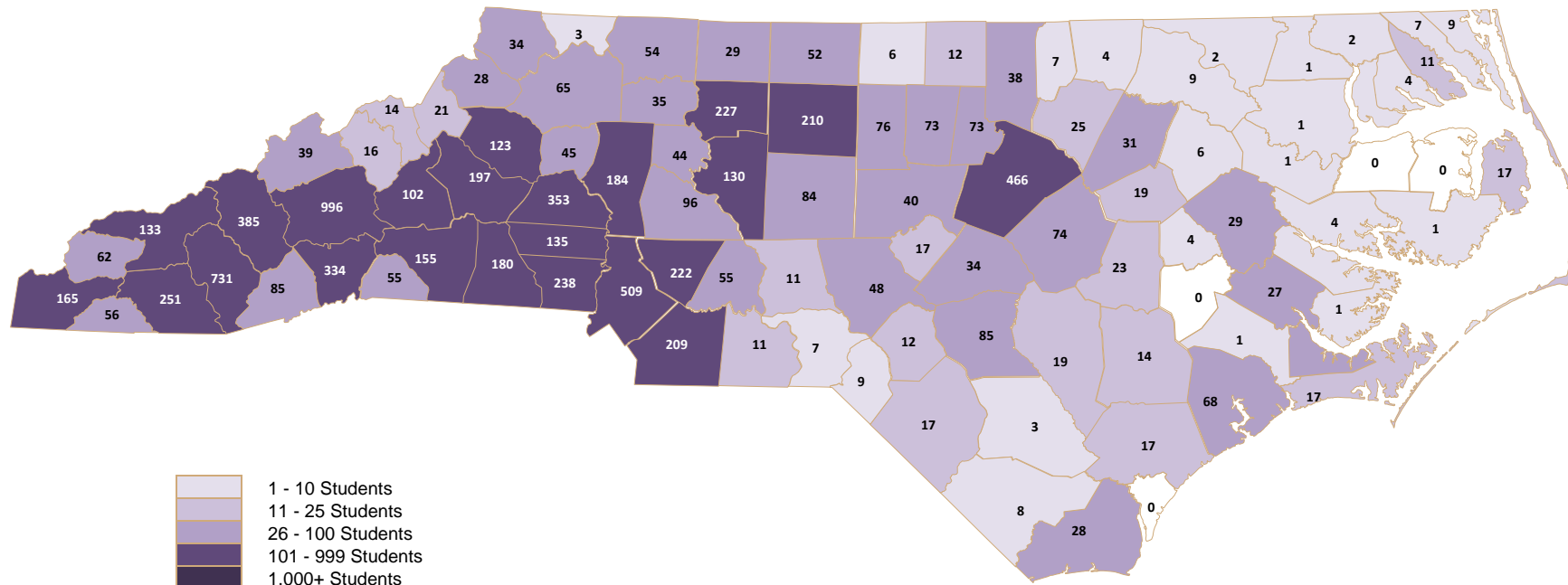

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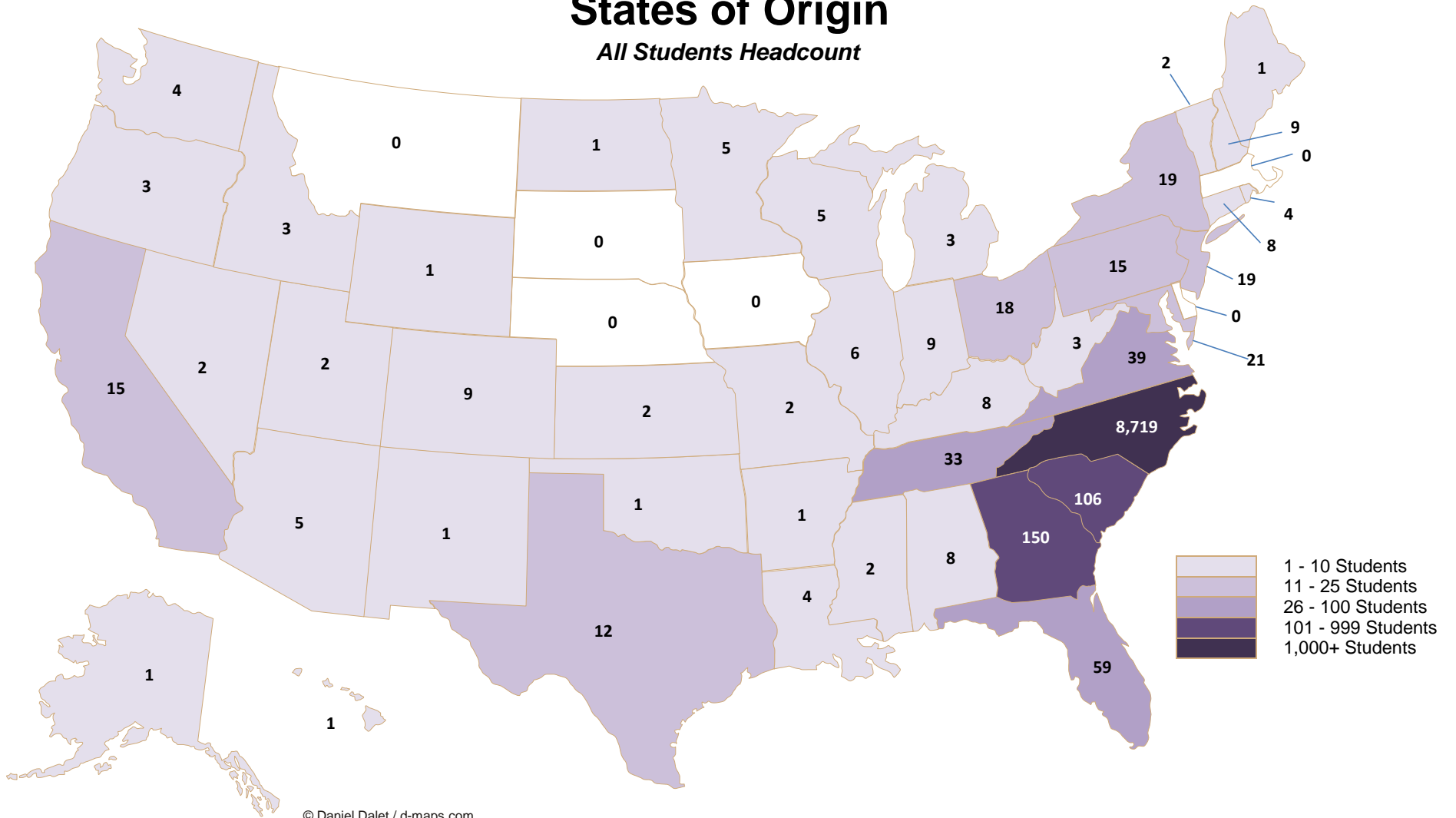
Counties of Origin

All Students Headcount



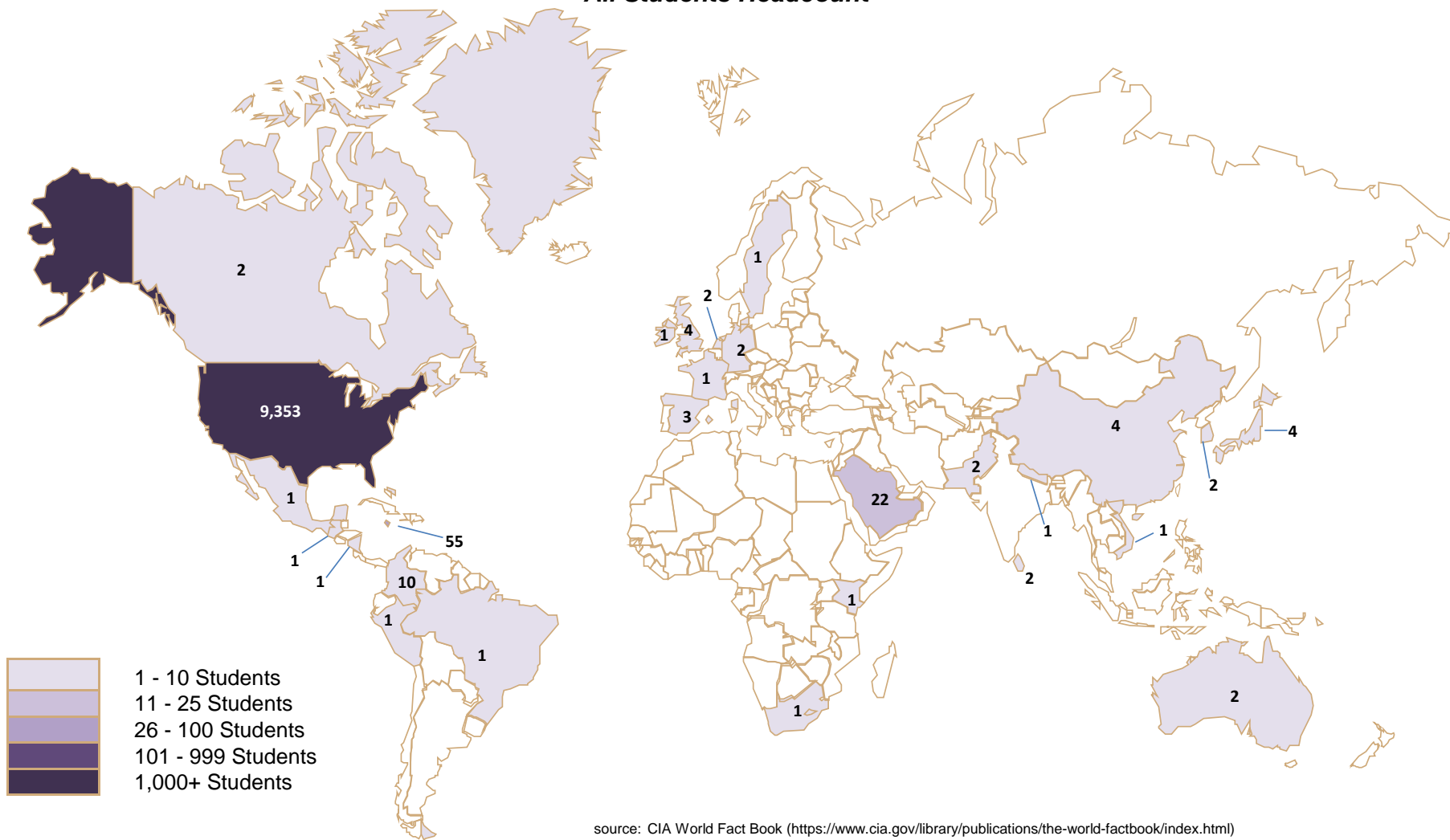
States of Origin

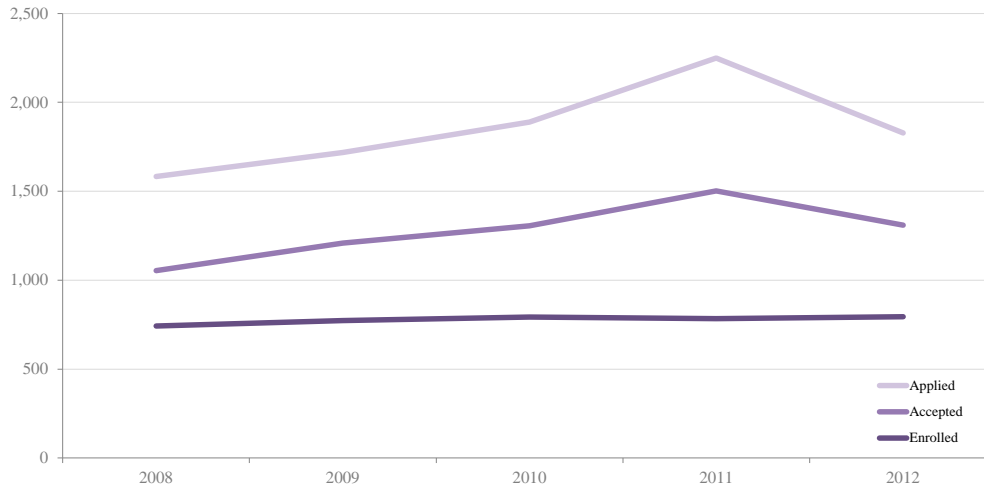

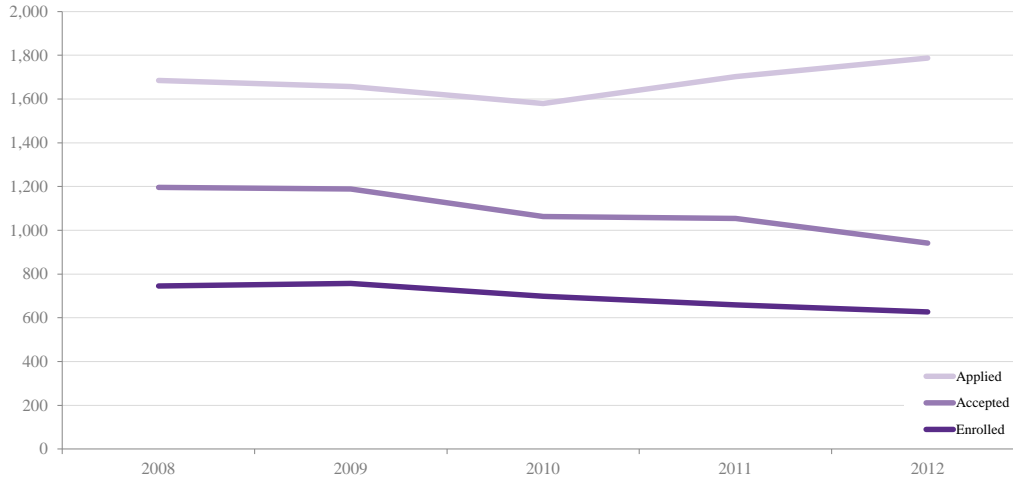

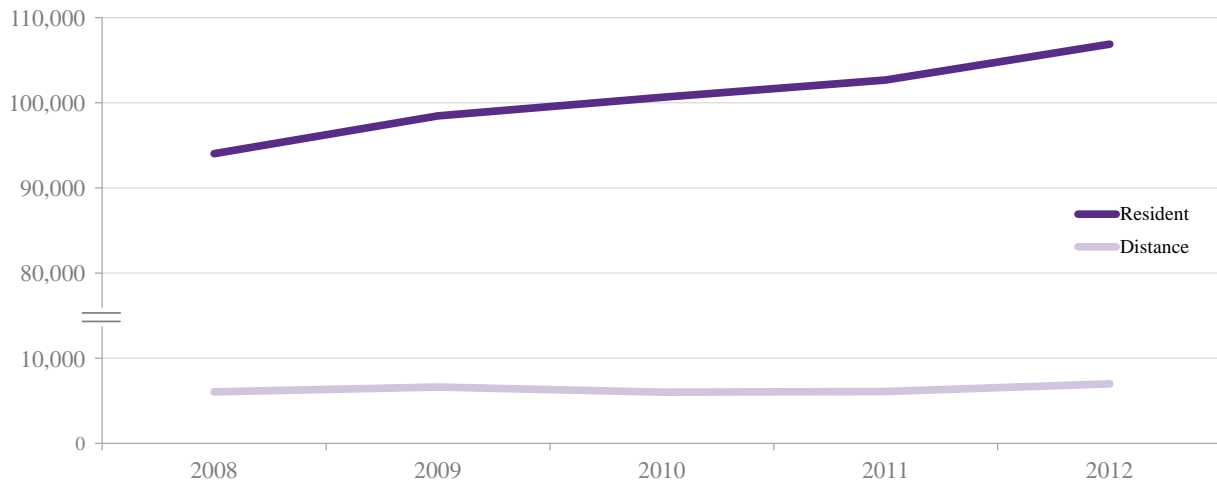

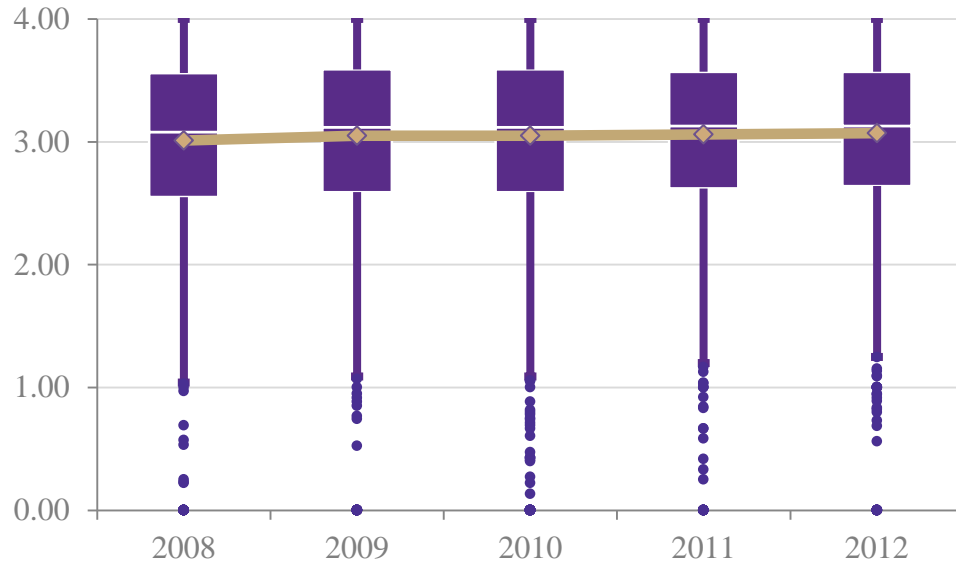

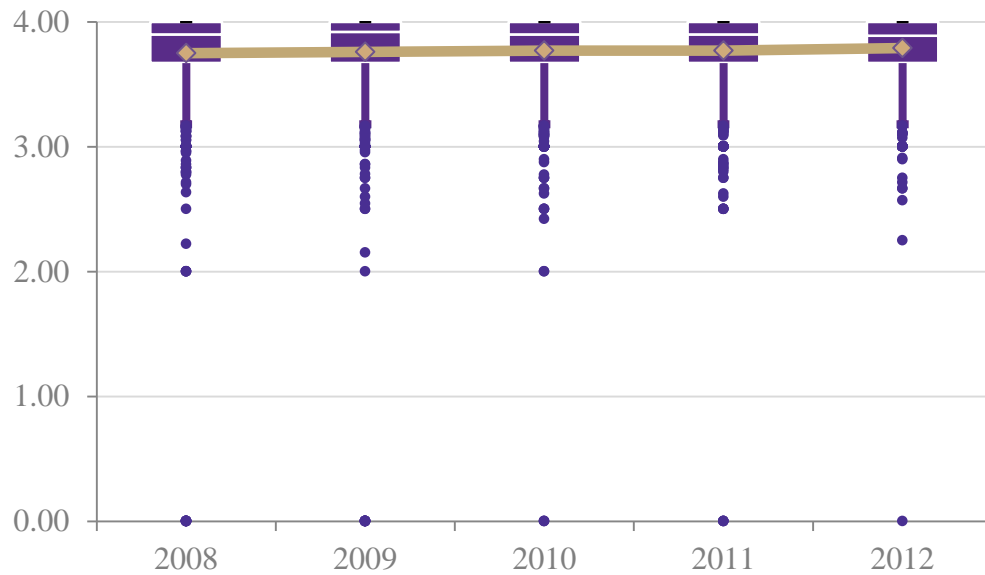

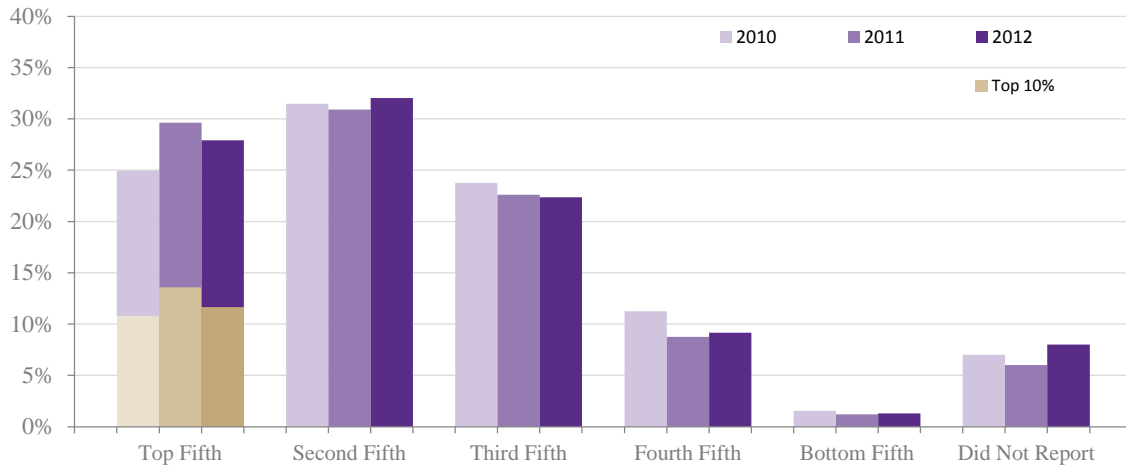

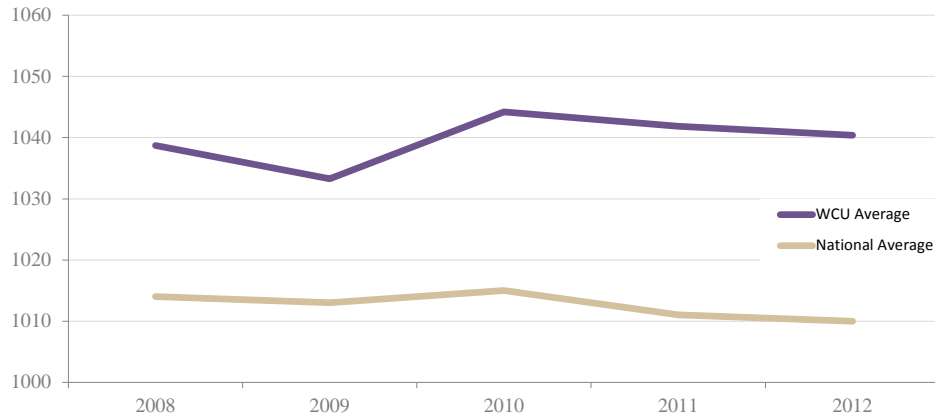

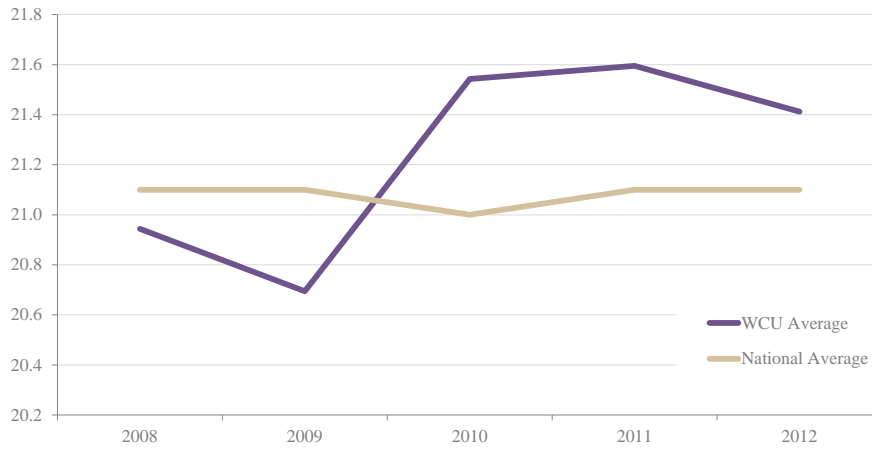

First-Time Full-Time Freshmen

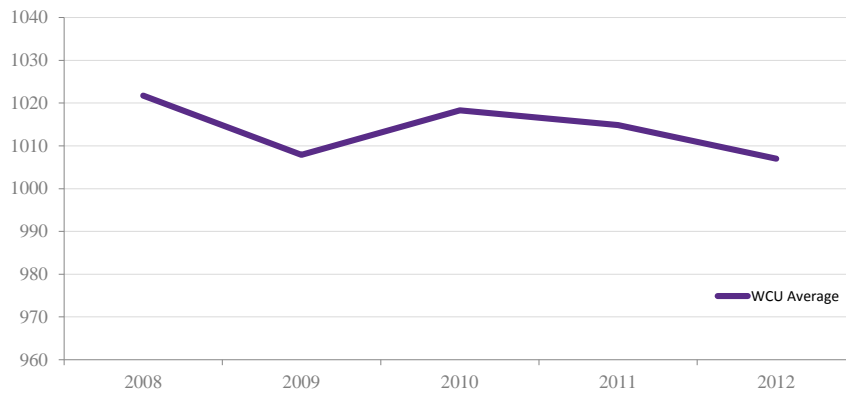

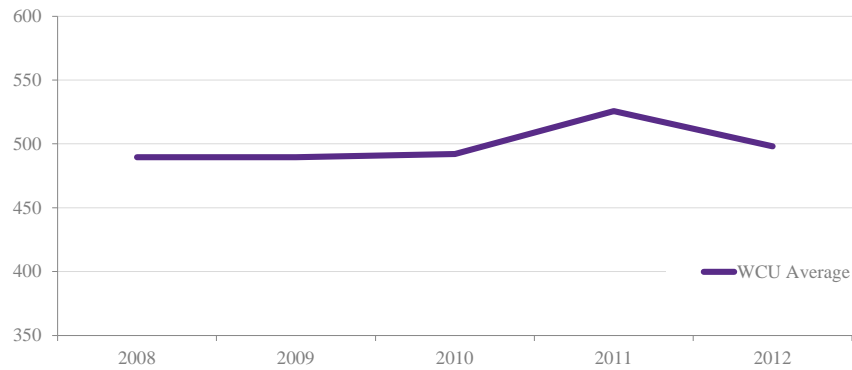
