Articulation Agreement between Southwestern Community College Associate of Applied Science in Outdoor Leadership Degree and Western Carolina University Bachelor of Science in Parks and Recreation.

- A. Students who complete the General Education Core, the Associate of Arts degree, or the Associate of Science degree will have their Liberal Studies requirements at Western Carolina University waived.
- B. If the above statement does not apply and 15.1 or more semester hours are transferred into WCU the first semester, the First Year Seminar is not required at WCU.
- C. If Liberal Studies requirements are not waived at WCU then students must take a course that has been <u>approved</u> as an Upper-Level Perspectives course (300-400) in one of the Perspectives categories.
- D. Total hours required for a BS in Parks and Recreation is 120 hours.
- E. This agreement will run continually without the need for renewal. Updates to the agreement will be initiated and processed every two years. The update process will be completed as follows: copies of this agreement will be distributed to deans and department heads by February 1 of each update year. Updates or "no change" approvals to this agreement should be returned by March 15. If curriculum changes are identified by either institution during the review process, parties from both institutions will review and approve the proposed changes and make necessary updates to the course equivalency outline.
- F. Either party upon written notice can terminate this agreement. If the agreement is terminated, Southwestern Community College students who have matriculated at WCU can continue until completion of the baccalaureate degree if they are continuously enrolled at Western. Also, students who are enrolled at Southwestern Community College at the time may continue under the terms of the agreement as long as they are continuously enrolled. If the student ceases enrollment for two regular academic semesters, he/she must re-enroll under the most recently adopted agreement.

TIPS FOR TRANSFERRING SUCCESSFULLY TO WCU

1. Meet with your SCC advisor the first semester of your enrollment to develop a course plan to ensure that you enroll in the appropriate classes to transfer to WCU.

- 2. Attend a WCU visitation with Student Support Services to talk with an admissions counselor, tour campus, and meet with an advisor in your intended major. Invitations will be sent via SCC email in the fall and spring semesters.
- 3. Submit your application for admission by the established deadlines.
- 4. Once accepted follow the Next Steps as outline by WCU which includes:
 - a. Paying the tuition deposit by the required deadline;
 - b. Submitting immunization information by the required deadline;
 - c. Submitting your financial aid application by the WCU deadlines.
 - d. Attending the required orientation for transfer students.
- 5. Submit an official final transcript showing your most recently completed classes.
- 6. Utilize the WCU Advising Center to navigate the registration and enrollment process each semester.
- 7. Participate in the WCU PRM/ SCC visit/lunch.
