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### SECTION 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

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#### SECTION 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Personal precautions, protective equipment and: emergency procedures	Remove all sources of ignition. Use personal protective equipment. Follow safe handling advice and personal protective equipment recommendations.
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Environmental precautions:	Discharge into the environment must be avoided. Prevent further leakage or spillage if safe to do so. Prevent spreading over a wide area (e.g. by containment or oil barriers). Retain and dispose of contaminated wash water. ##### Engineering measures:

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#### Personal protective equipment

Respiratory protection:	General and local exhaust ventilation is recommended to maintain vapor exposures below recommended limits. 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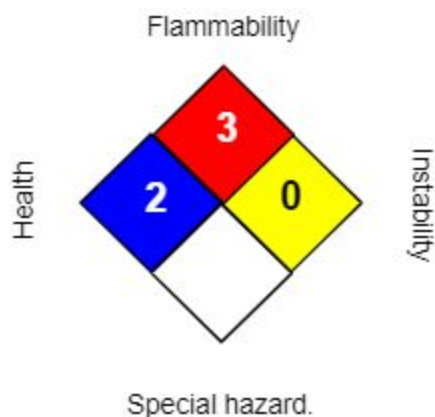
