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Biography

Gabe is a Human Communication instructor, scholar, and consultant based in the United States. He earned undergraduate and graduate degrees in Communication Studies from The University of North Carolina at Greensboro. He works as a full-time instructor in the Western Carolina University Department of Communication, where he teaches the foundational human communication course and conducts a variety of independent and collaborative research projects. Beyond academia, Gabe's experiences range from consultant for regional businesses, non-profit marketing and communications work, to providing expert social media commentary for CNN Business.

Gabe's scholarship relates to three primary areas of inquiry:

- (1) Critical-rhetorical perspectives on political communication, particularly on the relationships between political narratives and ideologies.
- (2) The role of social media platforms and digital communication in constructing identity for users and for shaping public discourse, specifically regarding discourses on gender and masculinity.
- (3) Communication education and theory, and scholarship of teaching and learning.

Currently, Gabe is finalizing a co-authored handbook chapter on Public Speaking Pedagogy and Democracy with WCU colleague, Vincent Russell. Gabe's other works are featured in *Southern Communication Journal*, the edited book collection, *Rhetoric of Masculinity: Male Body Image, Media, and Gender Role Stress/Conflict*, and in *Flow: A Critical Forum on Media and Culture*. He has served as assistant to the editor for the Carolinas Communication Association *Annual*, and as a reviewer for The National Communication Association's Communication Theory and Rhetoric division and for the journal *Information & Culture*.
