

Pre-Medicine

In order to become an physician you must:

- complete a bachelor's degree (in any major) <u>WCU Undergraduate Major Options</u>
- decide to apply to Allopathic (M.D.), Osteopathic (D.O.), or both types of medical programs Comparison
- complete appropriate prerequisite coursework and shadowing requirements (see list of programs for details)
- take the Medical College Admission Test (MCAT) <u>Examprep.wcu.edu</u>
- apply through <u>AMCAS</u> (allopathic) or <u>AACOMAS</u> (osteopathic), some colleges require secondary applications
- complete a course of study at medical school List of programs: <u>Allopathic</u> / <u>Osteopathic</u>
- complete a residency program (average of 3 7 years)
- complete all necessary certification and licensure examinations

What should I major in?

While there is no prescribed major for admission into a medical school, it is imperative that students complete all required courses for admission. Medical schools vary significantly in their requirements, and it is important for you to learn what coursework the schools that interest you require. Students should choose their major according to their strengths, interests and alternative career choices. There are some excellent summer programs for future doctors. Students may consider attending these programs between their junior and senior years.

If a student is wishing to apply to ECU or UNC medical schools, they should pay careful attention to each school's required prerequisite courses as listed on their websites.

Minimally, a student should complete these courses at WCU for entrance into many medical schools
