Courses taught include:

- **Introduction to Professional Writing (English 303):** Students are introduced to workplace writing and the concentration of professional writing in the English Studies department. They are taught common forms, genres, research, and styles associated with business and professional writing.
- **Writing in Electronic Environments (English 304):** Students explore writing in terms of online audiences and analyze the influence of technology on writing and the messages we form in digital spaces. Students are taught about the principles associated with web site design and use rhetorical analysis to properly incorporate those principles in hands-on projects.
- **Editing and Publishing (English 307):** Students learn about and practice all levels of editing and explore issues associated with the field of editing, such as globalization, localization, translation, and bias. Students are also taught and practice the basics of information design.
- **Proposal and Grant Writing (English 315):** Students are taught fundamentals of proposal and grant writing, including searching for funders, conducting appropriate research, and writing sections of a proposal. Half of the course is devoted to exploring issues of social justice in proposal and grant writing practices.
- **Writing for Careers (English 401):** The focus of this class is communication in the workplace with an emphasis on skills and background needed for specialized professions including STEM, editing and publishing, technical writing, and medical writing. Students also are taught other forms of workplace writing, such as how to write self and peer evaluations.
- **Introduction to Technical Communication (English 402):** Students use real-life assignments to learn effective composition in several professional and technical communication genres.
- **Grammar for Writers (English 412):** Students reinforce their knowledge of grammar and incorporate strategies to effectively use grammar as a means of achieving different styles in writing. They also learn how to conduct critical analysis of texts and explore how grammar is used to achieve particular goals.
- **Studies in Professional Writing (English 429):** The theme for this course has been environmental and nature writing where students practice writing to various audiences and critically examine social and ethical aspects of scientific and environmental communication.

- **English Capstone, Professional Writing Internship (English 389, 483, and 589).** Supervise undergraduate and graduate students on internships.
- **Proposal and Grant Writing (English 603):** Graduate course. Students explore the practical and theoretical aspects of proposal and grant writing in the sciences and humanities, and explore issues of social justice in this line of work.
- **Writing in Electronic Environments (English 604):** Graduate course. Students explore practical, theoretical, and ethical principles related to digital literacy, electronic collaboration, and visual rhetoric.
- **Advanced Issues in Technical and Professional Communication (English 605):** Graduate course. Students are introduced to theory, practice, research, and ethics in technical and professional communication.
