

- Support robust programing in our offices of Intercultural Affairs and Residential Living





Room Selection

Information about Room Selection for continuing students for 2024 – 2025 is available at roomselection.wcu.edu. Here are a few important notes to help your student with their room selection process:

 All continuing students must pay the \$150.00 nonrefundable Continuing Student Housing Deposit to participate in room selection. The deposit opened for continuing students on February 1, 2024. The deposit can be paid in the student's MyWCU account or Student Accounts.

- Students who are not eligible to re-claim their current room for 2024 – 2025 will receive a notice later this month to let them know they are not eligible to reclaim.
- Selection of space on campus will take place after Spring Break. The date schedule is below:
 - March 12 Same Room Selection from 7:00 am 4:00 pm.
 - March 13 Same Room Selection Roommate and Suitemate Pull-in from 7:00 am – 4:00 pm.
 - March 15 Honors Room Selection and Roommate and Suitemate Pull-in from 7:00 am – 4:00 pm. Brinson Honors College students can only claim a room in Balsam or Blue Ridge.
 - March 19 Judaculla Suite Requests due. Groups of 4 students who want to occupy a full suite in Judaculla can apply by 5:00 pm.
 - March 20 Judaculla Suite allocations made.
 - March 23 Open Room Selection and Roommate and Suitemate Pull-in. Log-in times will be sent to students on March 22. Log-in starts at 9:00 am and continues until all students select.





 The Department of Residential Living requires the current first-year class who entered in the Summer or Fall of 2023 to live in on-campus housing during their second academic year (AY 2024-2025).

- Students impacted by this decision should not sign a lease for an off-campus housing provider for the 2024 – 2025 academic year.

The Writing and Learning Commons

The Writing and Learning Commons (WaLC) offers writing support, course tutoring, and academic skills consults. Their office is located in Belk 207, and in the spring, its hours of operation are Monday - Thursday, 8:00 am – 9:00 pm, and Friday, 8:00 am – 5:00 pm.

- Students can make appointments with tutors by logging in to <u>Navigate</u> or calling 828-227-2274.
- Tutors provide a mix of in-person and virtual appointments.
- In addition to our services, distance students can access <u>Brainfuse</u>, an online tutoring platform.
- The <u>Math Tutoring Center</u> in Stillwell 437 provides math tutoring support.


Health Services Stay Healthy Message

Several respiratory illnesses continue to circulate in our community. Flu, COVID, and RSV have increased across the United States. Please encourage your student to take precautions to avoid getting sick and spreading the illness to others.

Practice preventative measures:

- The number one way to prevent the spread of germs is to wash your hands.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Cover your mouth and nose when you cough or sneeze.

If your student has symptoms of respiratory illness, cough, fever, body ache, runny nose, or sneezing, ask them to contact Health Services at 828-227-7640 to speak with a respiratory nurse. Health Services also has an array of over-the-counter medications that treat many of these symptoms. At-home COVID tests are also available for purchase for \$6.00 per test. We hope your student has a great Spring Semester and stays healthy.

Under most circumstances, WCU staff cannot disclose any information about a case after a report has been submitted. We may not be able to keep your identity anonymous.
