What If I change my major from Nursing to...

NUTRITION & DIETETICS

What is Nutrition & Dietetics?

Registered Dietitian Nutritionists (RDNs) are experts in food and nutrition. They advise people on what to eat in order to lead a healthy lifestyle or achieve a specific health-related goal. They may do so through management, clinical practice, community and public health, business, or education and research.

What can I do with a degree in Nutrition & Dietetics?

Students are eligible to apply for dietetic internships upon graduation to become a Registered Dietitian Nutritionist (RDN). Students not entering a dietetic internship may choose to become a Nutrition and Dietetic Technician (NDTR). Employment settings include: Hospitals, health departments, healthcare facilities, nursing homes, government & non-profit agencies, community centers, school systems, wellness & fitness centers, private practice.

How could this program help me pursue applying to an Accelerated BSN program?

Common pre-requisites for ABSN programs include:

- ChemistryAnatomy & Physiology 1 & 2
- Human NutritionMicrobiology

- Statistics
- General Psychology

All of the above courses are also required for Nutrition & Dietetics!

Students in this program gain a thorough understanding of how diet contributes to the prevention, diagnosis, treatment, and maintenance of health and disease in clients and communities. Students will have opportunities for research, direct patient care, and in the planning and evaluation of meals and nutrition programs.

What are the Application Requirements for Nutrition & Dietetics?

Applications occur once a year with the deadline around the start of spring semester. Application requirements include:

- One experience related to nutrition (paid or volunteer)
- Involvement in one campus extracurricular activity or club
- Minimum 2.8 overall GPA; Minimum 3.0 Pre-requisite GPA
- Recommendations from instructors teaching Nutrition or other pre-requisite courses.

If you are considering changing your major to Nutrition & Dietetics, it's ideal you know before the spring semester of your sophomore year.

Those that decide after the start of sophomore spring should consult with an advisor as soon as possible (see contact info below).
