IRB REVIEW AND APPROVAL PROCESS

WHAT IS THE ROLE OF IRB?

Protect the rights and welfare of human participants



ARE YOU CONDUCTING HUMAN SUBJECTS RESEARCH?

- Living individuals about whom research is being conducted.
- Research is a systematic investigation, including research development, testing and evaluation, designed to contribute to generalizable knowledge.

IS THE INFORMATION BEING COLLECTED ABOUT INDIVIDUALS?

- Gathers info or biospecimens through intervention or interaction with the individual.
- Uses, studies, analyzes or generates identifiable private information or biospecimens.



HOW TO DETERMINE IF YOUR PROJECT IS RESEARCH OR QUALITY IMPROVEMENT?

- Quality improvement: Only improves a practice or process (Not subject to IRB review)
- Research: Designed to contribute to generalizable knowledge.

DO CLASSROOM PROJECTS REQUIRE IRB APPROVAL?

• If students only present their study in a classroom; the project does not meet the definition of research



because it does not contribute to generalizable knowledge.

WHEN TO SUBMIT YOUR PROJECT TO THE IRB?

• The IRB must review and approve the project prior to investigators beginning any proposed research activity (including recruitment of subjects).
